WHAT IS ACADEMIC SUCCESS?



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BACKGROUND ON ACADEMIC SUCCESS

- Researchers have examined various definitions of academic success (e.g., Kuh et al., 2006; York, Gibson & Rankin, 2015).
- Currently there is a lack of empirical research on how teachers define academic success themselves.

Research Questions:

- How do teachers and preservice teachers define academic success for their students?
- 2. Do definitions of academic success differ for these two groups?

METHODS

We recruited 210 teachers:

- Percentage Female: 70%
- M age: 38 years
- M years teaching: 12 years

When you think about students' academic success, how do **YOU** define "academic success?

Responses were analyzed using content analysis.

We recruited 196 pre-service teachers:

- Percentage Female: 78%
- Mean age: 25 years





When a student is able to increase their knowledge and learning.

Learning

That the student actually learns something, genuinely learns something.

"ACADEMIC SUCCESS?

Demonstrate Achievement

I think academic success reflects a students performance summatively in academic areas.

Achieving high marks as evaluated by teachers.

Students are getting a high grade.



"ACADEMIC SUCCESS?

Future Oriented

Achieving the academic results that enable students to follow the life and career paths they envision for themselves.

Preparing students for society as a whole.

Become life long learners.



"ACADEMIC SUCCESS?

Growth

It is the **progress** a student makes from the beginning of the year and all the way to the end.

A constant improvement throughout the course.

When a student is able to **grow**



Goals

means setting goals and actively working to get closer to those goals.

that the students reach their academic goals



"ACADEMIC SUCCESS?

I see academic success as something that is variable between students.

Individual (Individualized)

Should be defined differently for everyone because students are all unique.



"ACADEMIC SUCCESS?

Positive Emotions

enjoying their classroom experience and learning.

When a student is **excited** and **happy** to be in school every day.

When a student is interested in what they are learning



"ACADEMIC SUCCESS?

Student's become invested in their learning and take pride in what/how they learn.

Attitudes/ Mindsets


When a student tries their best.
