


"I didn't know I was cheating!" Students' Perceptions of Academically Dishonest Behaviours

#### ACADEMIC DISHONESTY

- Rates of student academic misconduct are increasing (Edwardson, 2020).
- Moreover, the number of cases in Canada that are making local news is alarming (Eaton, 2020).
- In a world where most information can be "Googled" or found easily online, students may not understand what academic dishonesty is.

PURPOSE: To examine how students rated various behaviours in terms of academic dishonesty.



#### **METHOD**


**166** students completed the survey.


- ightharpoonup Age 20-48 (M = 24.8)
- ▶ 49% Male


"to what extent do you consider the following activities as forms of academic dishonesty."


On a scale from 1(not at all) to 7(very much so).













# 13. Asking students who have taken the exam for the questions.






# 14. Including information you know is inaccurate in an assignment.






### 15. Submitting an assignment without citing all resources used.






#### 16. Lying to get an extension on a due date.
