

High Schools Over... Now What?

Factors that go into Decisions to attend Postsecondary Education

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INTRODUCTION


- In the 2014/15 academic year over two million Canadians were enrolled at a postsecondary institution (PSI; Frank, Frenette & Morissette (2015), and these numbers continue to grow.
- Students have various motives or explanations as to why they have selected to pursue postsecondary education.
- Therefore, the purpose of our study was twofold:
 - 1. To examine the reasons students provide for attending (or not attending) postsecondary.
 - 2. To make recommendations for supports and services available to students.

METHOD

- We surveyed 291 grade 12 students from various high schools in a mid-sized Canadian city about their plans for after high school.
- Students mean age was 17.36, years (16 to 19).
- 51% identified as male, 46% identified as female and 3% identified as non-binary.
- Students were asked:
 - What are your plans for after high school?
 - How did you decide on your plans for after high school? Please include any factors you considered in your decision.

RESULTS

- 23% of students did not plan to attend a PSI.
- 77% of student said they planned to attend a
 PSI after finishing high school.
 - We identified three main themes in their reasons to attend postsecondary education:
 - Influential individuals
 - Motivational factors
 - Personal attributes
 - 31% of students who said yes, mentioned being unsure of their decision.



DISCUSSION

- Our results are consistent with previous research, suggesting there are numerous reasons that students identify for going on to complete a postsecondary education (e.g., Fermin & Pope, 2003; MacAllum, et al., 2007).
- Furthermore, we found that 3 in 4 students plan to attend a PSI, and the largest portion of students who said they were not attending PSI, planned to upgrade to attend a PSI later on.
 - This demonstrates the importance placed on attending postsecondary which is found in research (e.g., Carnevale, et al., 2012) and online (e.g., www.collegeforjobs.com).

FUTURE DIRECTION

- Interestingly, roughly one in three students in each group said "I don't know," suggesting even in their last semester of high school students are still uncertain of their decisions.
- Supports and services must be provided to students as they make this important decision.
- One avenue might be for PSIs to connect with high schools and offer programs where students come to campus and are student there for a day.
 - They could sit in lectures they are interested in, and see postsecondary education firsthand to aid them in their decisions.

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
